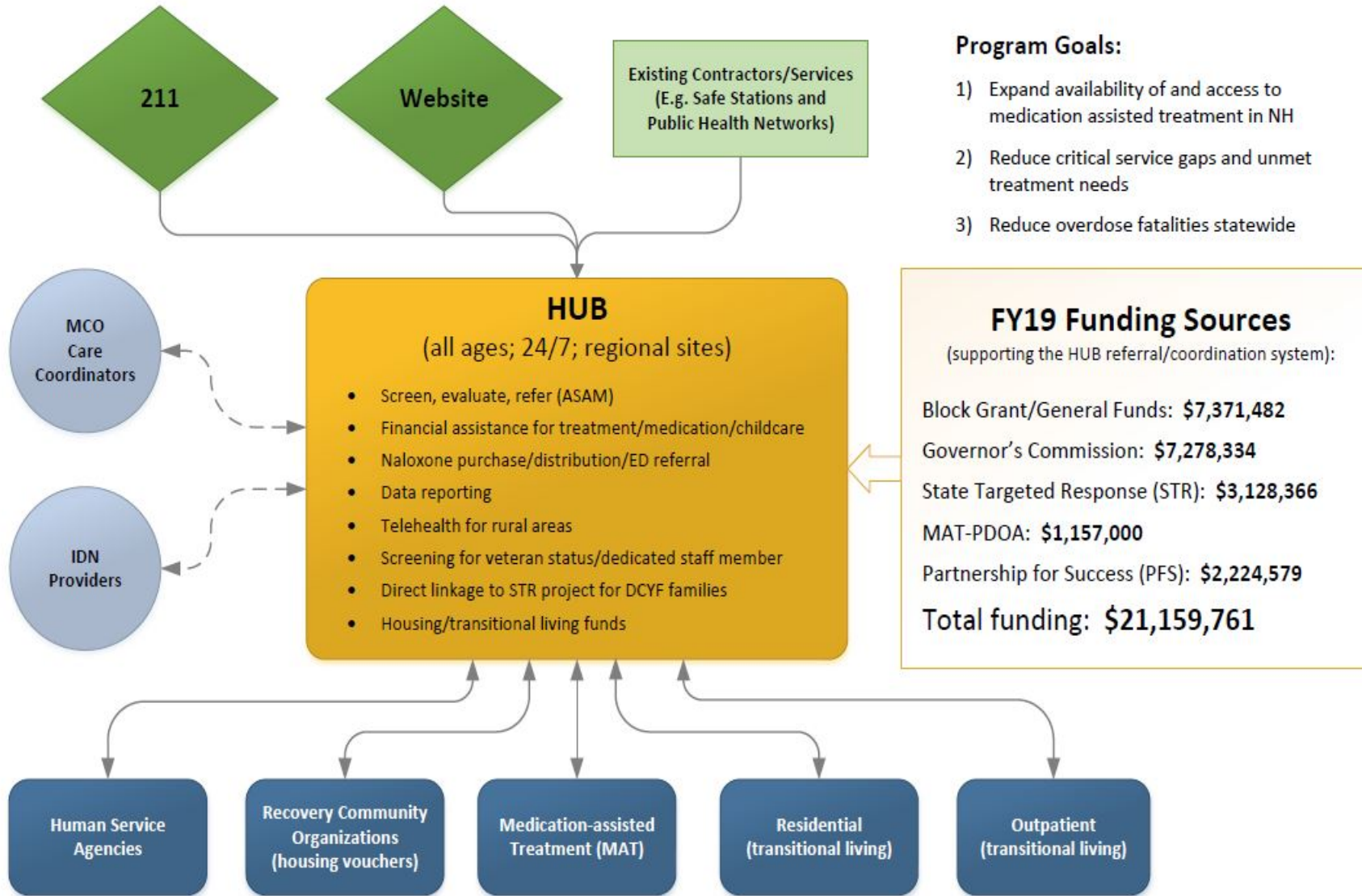


Current Substance Use Disorder Delivery System

- **Broad array of services delivered through non- and for-profit organizations**
 - **Outpatient and Residential Treatment**
 - **Medication Assisted Treatment**
 - **Peer Recovery Support Services**
 - **Sober Housing**
 - **Transitional Housing**
- **Funded by variety of sources**
 - **Commercial Insurance**
 - **Medicaid**
 - **Federal, State & Foundation Grants**
 - **Counties & Local Communities**
 - **Governor's Commission on Alcohol and Other Drugs**

State Opioid Response Grant Opportunity

- NH awarded \$45,965,216 for Federal Fiscal Year 18 and 19
- Two years to spend funds
 - State FY19:\$22,982,608
 - State FY20:\$22,982,608
- Funding specific to opioid use disorder (OUD)
- Funding goals:
 - increase access to medication-assisted treatment
 - reduce unmet treatment need
 - reduce opioid overdose related deaths



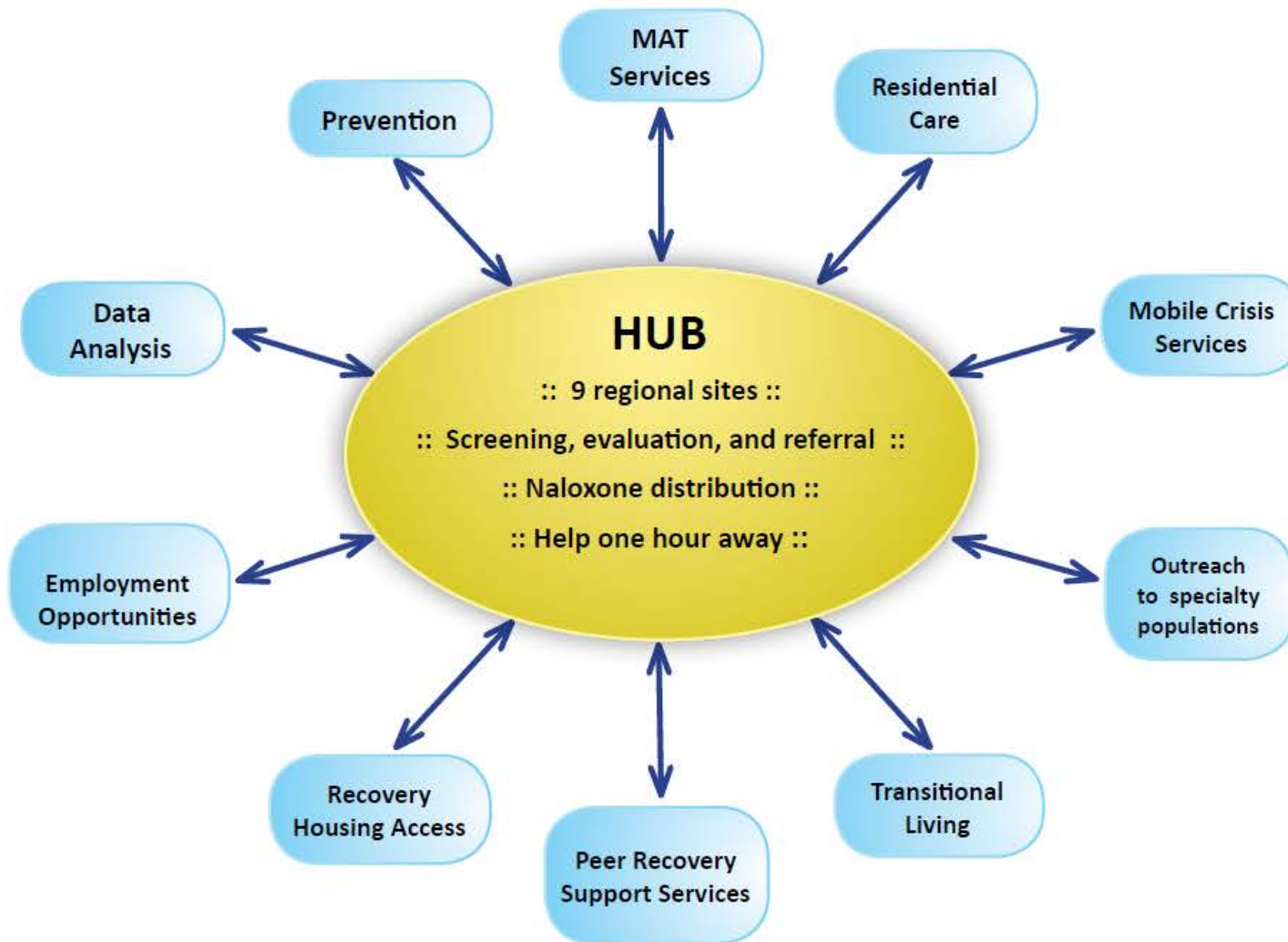
State Opioid Response Grant Opportunity

- Require use of evidence based treatment for OUD (MAT), alignment with State Targeted Response grant strategic plan, services delivered by the **third month** after grant award
- Key populations include: Veterans/service members, Ryan White HIV AIDS program, justice involved/re-entering the community
- Of the \$22,982,608 per year
 - Up to 2% may be spent on data collection
 - Up to 5% may be spent on administration of the grant
- Key staff required:
 - Must include Project Director
 - Must include full-time State Opioid Coordinator position: responsible for coordinating opioid-related federal funding across the State

CDC Opioid Public Health Crisis Grant Opportunity

- NH awarded \$3,915,954 for Federal Fiscal Year 18 and 19
- Funding period is September 1, 2018 – August 31, 2019 19.
- Proposal developed collaboratively across the Department and with other key state agencies.
- Activities are coordinated with the State Opioid Response (SOR) grant to maximize impact of both.
- Funding goals:
 - Enhance state capacity to rapidly respond to the opioid overdose crisis, through improved data collection and prevention efforts.
 - To develop and disseminate jurisdiction-level vulnerability assessments that identify sub-regional (e.g., county, census tract) areas at high risk for (1) opioid overdoses and (2) areas at high risk for bloodborne infections
