

Voting in New Hampshire

How do I register to vote?

- By visiting your city or town clerk's office and completing a voter registration form and showing proof of domicile.
- By attending sessions held by your local supervisors of the checklist.
- You may also register at the polls on Election Day.

When you register, the clerk will ask for:

- Proof of identity, age, citizenship, and domicile.
- Proof of domicile includes driver's license, rental agreement, state or federal tax forms, or other, which can be found at: sos.nh.gov/nhsos_content.aspx?id=8589972818

Can I vote absentee?

If you will be absent on election day or you cannot appear at any time during polling hours because of an employment obligation you may request an absentee ballot from either your city or town clerk or the NH Secretary of State.

Voting in Vermont

How do I register to vote?

- Eligible persons may register to vote on any day up to and including the day of the election. Registration is available during business hours of your town clerk's office on days preceding the election and during polling hours on Election Day.
- Applications can be obtained from your local town clerk or online at: www.sec.state.vt.us/elections/voters/registration.aspx.
- First-time voters who register by mail or online are required to include a copy of identification, such as a valid photo ID, current utility bill or bank statement, or copy of another government identification document.

Can I vote absentee?

- Any voter can request that the town clerk mail an early voter absentee ballot, which must be received by the close of polls on Election Day.
- A voter may also vote at the town clerk's office in person during regular business hours up to 45 days before the general election.
