Description of Site (location, focus of work)	Community Health Improvement Department at Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center (DHCH) works to measurably improve health and well-being through access to care and care system improvement; clinic-community initiatives to address patient needs; and working with clinic and community partners to change and improve community conditions that impact health and well-being. The Substance Misuse Team/ALL Together is a coalition that focuses on regional substance misuse continuum of care. Using tools such as community health assessments and analysis, the coalition serves as a community resource for prevention, treatment, recovery and advocacy of substance misuse and suicide.				
Project Description	ALL Together/DHCH Substance Misuse Team is in need of understanding the health curriculum needs for the K-12 schools in both the Upper Valley (UV) and Greater Sullivan County (GSC) regions. A survey or assessment tool should be developed and distributed to all school stakeholders in both regions to understand what exists for health curriculums currently and what if any needs for curriculum there might be. A main focus is to discover if evidence based curriculums exist in any of our schools currently and if they are satisfied with them. Additionally research needs to be conducted on evidence based health curriculums for K-12 schools nationally and this research would be culminated into a final summary report. Pairing the results of the health education survey with the research and any local data including Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) data, to make recommendations for which curriculums may be recommended for schools in our two regions.
