


Career Development Awards (K Awards) for Individuals with a Health-Professional Doctorate

Research project grant (R)

Small grants = R21 Larger grants = R01

"Foundation Grants"

The rules

Typically for smaller amounts (\$10-100k) Shorter applications Lower expectations of preliminary data

Benefits

Good grant writing practice
Seed money for larger proposals
Buys a little protected time
Buys a little extra supplies money
Can cover the difference b/w a K award and your salary
Gives you credibility

The rules

4-5 years
Supplies (\$10-20k)
Salary (\$75k for 75%)
Lower expectations of preliminary data

Translation

K08: basic sciences

K23: clinical

K99/R00: non-independent PhD, maybe MD

Benefits

Good grant writing practice
Buys you time and reagents to generate papers and preliminary data
Can cover the difference b/w a K award and your salary
Might be enough by itself
Gives you credibility

How to get one

Make sure your topic is interesting to granting agency Come up with a feasible project that'll take a few years Show some good preliminary data and maybe paper(s) Obey their guidelines obsessively Get an example of a successful submission if possible Get feedback on your grant writing (Christopher Dant) Get a strong mentor with a proven mentorship history Articulate a good career development plan Research project grant (R)

Small grants = R21 Larger grants = R01

The rules

R03: "small" 1-2 years (≤\$50,000/yr)

R21: "exploratory" 1-2 years with salary + supplies (≤\$275,000 total)

R01: "the whole shootin' match" 4-5 years salary + supplies (≤\$250,000/yr)

Benefits

Keeps the boat afloat for years Makes you the king

Research project grant (R)

Small grants = R21 Larger grants = R01

NIH grant pages Search their RFA's

How to get one

Make sure your topic is interesting to them
Pick the right study committee for your topic/approach
Get really smokin' preliminary data
Obey their guidelines obsessively
Get an example of a successful submission if possible
Get feedback on your grant writing (Christopher Dant)
Get collaborators/consultants to address weaknesses
