TWO PART SERIES: HELPING CAREGIVERS DEVELOP AFFIRMATIVE UNDERSTANDINGS OF THEIR LGBTQIA+ YOUTH

LGBTQIA+ youth face significant health disparities, but research tells us that family support is the most critical protective factor that allows LGBTQIA+ youth to thrive. Caregivers can struggle to understand youth's journey, and as mental health providers, our role is to help them develop affirmative understandings and behaviors that can protect and uplift youth.

In Part 1 of this training, participants will learn some basic concepts and definitions related to gender diversity and affirming care. The presenters will discuss some frameworks for working with caregivers and youth in this population. A case study will be introduced.
